## Point-in-Time & Housing Inventory Count



- ☐ The *Point-In-Time (PIT)* Count is a count of sheltered and unsheltered people experiencing homelessness on a single night in January.
  - ☐ Unsheltered individuals are recorded homeless if they were surveyed during the 24 hour PIT count timeframe.
    - ☐ Two types of surveys were used for the PIT Count: Observed and Interviewed.
      - □ Observed: Any individual who declined an interviewed survey, and was determined by the surveyor to be "definitely" homeless.
      - ☐ Interviewed: Individuals who agreed to answer an array of questions about their current homeless situation.
  - Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires that Continuums of Care (CoC) conduct an annual count of people experiencing homelessness who are sheltered in emergency shelters, transitional housing, and safe havens on a single night.
  - The Housing Inventory Count (HIC) is a point-in-time inventory of provider programs within a CoC that provides beds and units dedicated to serving people experiencing homelessness; categorized by five program types: Emergency Shelter, Transitional Housing, Rapid Re-housing, Safe Haven, and Permanent Supportive Housing.
  - □ Palm Beach County PIT Count took place from noon on Thursday, January 25<sup>th</sup>, 2024 to noon on Friday, January 26<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
  - ☐ The CoC along with Palm Beach County employees and volunteers divided into groups to cover all of PBC (geographically) to count individuals experiencing homelessness within a 24-hour period.









## PIT – Sheltered Count 2024



- 546 persons sheltered.
  - 411 persons in Emergency Shelter.
  - □ 135 persons in Transitional Housing.







## PIT – Unsheltered Count 2024



- 1,580 unsheltered individuals and families experiencing homelessness were counted during the 2024 PIT Count.
  - 1222 Homeless interview surveys conducted.
  - 358 Observation surveys were conducted.






## 2024 PIT Count - Sheltered/Unsheltered



- The chart below shows the number of homeless individuals and families counted in sheltered/unsheltered locations.
- Sheltered Individuals and families that reside in Emergency Shelter, Transitional Housing programs, or Safe Havens.
- □ **Unsheltered** Individuals and families that reside in a place not meant for habitation (i.e., abandoned building, vehicle, camp-site).






### PIT Count - Unsheltered vs Sheltered



The chart below shows how many "Unsheltered" and "Sheltered" individuals and families were counted during the past five PIT Counts.






## 2024 PIT Count – Household Type



- The graph below shows how many "Individuals" and "Families" were surveyed in the last five PIT Counts.
- □ A few key notes from the data below:
  - □ Individuals increased by 396 persons from 2023 to 2024.
  - □ Families decreased by 125 persons from 2023 to 2024.
  - □ The overall PIT Count increased by 271 total persons from 2023 to 2024.







### 2024 PIT Count – Race



The Sheltered and Unsheltered pie charts below represent how many total individuals and families were counted in the PIT Count then that data is broken down by race.









## 2024 PIT Count – Ethnicity



□ The Sheltered and Unsheltered pie charts represent how many individuals and families were counted in the PIT Count then that data is broken down by ethnicity and shown below.









## 2024 PIT Count –Gender Identity



The chart below shows how many individuals and families were counted then that data is drilled down by their identified gender.








## 2024 PIT Count - Unsheltered Gender Identity



The chart below shows how many unsheltered individuals and families were counted then that data is represented by their Gender Identity.






### 2024 PIT Count – Shelters




- This chart represents our partner agencies who counted homeless individuals in their shelters on the night of the PIT Count. The Homeless Resource Center (HRC) is funded by PBC and run by Gulfstream Goodwill Industries Inc. and Adopt-A-Family of the Palm Beaches Inc.
- ☐ A total of 546 persons were sheltered.
- 411 persons in Emergency Shelter and 135 persons in Transitional Housing.










Martin County

- ☐ The highest number of unsheltered individuals and families were counted in District 7 with a count of 782.
- ☐ District 2 had the second highest number with an unsheltered count of 251.
- □ District 6 had the thirdhighest number with an unsheltered count of 225.
- Less than 135 individuals were counted in the remaining districts.





□ The charts below compare the amount of sheltered individuals and families in Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing in 2023 vs. 2024.







## 2023 to 2024 PIT Count – Subpopulations



- The graphs below show the subpopulations for both Sheltered and Unsheltered individuals and families in the 2023 and 2024 PIT Count.
- One subpopulation that saw a significant increase from 2023 to 2024 is Unsheltered Youth numbers, which rose from 32 persons to 72 persons.









## 2023 to 2024 PIT Count by Race



- The pie charts below represent the race of individuals and families that were counted in the 2023 and 2024 PIT count.
- □ A few key notes from the data below are:
  - From 2023 to 2024 there was a noticeable increase of individuals and families that identified as Black or African-American. An increase of 227 individuals and families.
  - □ All other races saw a minimal increase and/or decrease from 2023 to 2024.








## 2019-2024 PIT Special Populations




# 2023 and 2024 PIT Count of Individuals and Families



□ The bar graphs below represent the total number of individuals and family persons categorized by unsheltered and sheltered that were counted during the 2023 and 2024 PIT Count.









## 2023 and 2024 PIT Count Unsheltered Health Conditions



- The unsheltered pie charts represent how many individuals and families self-identified as having one or more health conditions during the 2023 and 2024 PIT Counts.
- The data below suggests that self-identifying health conditions rose from 2023 to 2024 in most categories, but the largest increase was Substance Use Disorder which rose from 128 individuals and families in 2023 to 601 in 2024.








## 2024 PIT Count– Race & Subpopulation






## 2024 PIT Count- Ethnicity & Subpopulation



The graphs below represent the ethnicity of sheltered and unsheltered individuals and families. The data is categorized by families, individuals, and subpopulations.









## 2024 PIT Count – Age Range



The graph below shows the number of unsheltered individuals and families experiencing homelessness by their reported or perceived age.








## 2023 and 2024 PIT Count Unsheltered – Chronic Homelessness

- □ **Chronic Homelessness** 12 consecutive months homeless or 4+ occasions totaling 12 months over a span of 3 years.







## 2023 and 2024 Chronically Homeless Individuals comparison to HMIS
